

DUDLEY ALLEN SARGENT

Since 1980, the Dudley Allen Sargent Lecture honors the memory of a leader who devoted his professional career to promoting health and fitness for both men and women. Following a brief stint as a circus acrobat, he enrolled as a freshman at Bowdoin College when he was eighteen. Sargent supported himself through the years as the director of a college gymnasium for a salary of five dollars per week. His charismatic personality and leadership skills attracted weak and non-athletic males, who were his real concern, as well as the stronger, more highly skilled students.

Sargent then moved to Yale, where he earned his medical degree while serving as director of the gymnasium. During this time, he argued for the inclusion of physical exercising as a part of the required coursework. After securing his M.D. in 1878, he opened his own gymnasium in New York City. In 1879, Sargent was invited to fill the position of Director of the Hemenway Gymnasium and Assistant Professor of Physical Training at Harvard, where he remained until retiring in 1919. His faculty rank, however, was removed in 1889, though he kept the title of Director of Hemenway Gymnasium.

During his long and distinguished career, Sargent invented numerous "developing machines," compiled thousands of anthropometric measurements of Harvard students, educated several generations of physical education teachers (primarily women) through his Harvard Summer School of Physical Education, as well as, the Sargent School for Physical Education. Sargent wrote extensively on the subject of health and fitness, thus significantly influencing the fledgling field.

Sargent served ably as president of the American Association for the Advancement of Physical Education (AAAPE) for five years, as well as, being the third president (1899) of the Society of Physical Education in College, a forerunner for today's NAKHE.

Dr. Hans van der Mars received his Ph.D. from The Ohio State University (1984). He is a Professor at Arizona State University, where he directs the undergraduate, masters and doctoral degree programs in Sport Pedagogy and Physical Education Teacher Education. Previous university faculty appointments included Oregon State (1992-2007), Arizona State University (1986-1992), and the University of Maine-Orono (1983-1986). Dr. van der Mars has co-authored over 100 published research papers, professional papers, book chapters, proceedings papers, and co-authored three textbooks. He has made 225 invited, keynote, research and professional presentations at international, national, regional and state conferences. He frequently provides professional development and outreach workshops for K-12 physical education teachers. He served as Co-Editor for the Journal of Teaching in Physical Education (JTPE) from 1998-2002 and has served as a reviewer for 14 national and international research and professional journals.


Dr. van der Mars is a Fellow in the Society of Physical and Health Educators of America (2005), the American Academy of Kinesiology & Physical Education (2006), and the North American Society of Health, Physical Education, Recreation, Sport, and Dance Professionals (2009). Examples of leadership include serving on the SHAPE America Board of Directors (2015-2017), the President's Council on Fitness, Sport and Nutrition Science Board (2011-2014), and the National Physical Activity Plan Alliance's National Physical Activity Plan-Education Sector Advisory Panel (2013-2016). His professional service included serving on Arizona Health & Physical Education Board of Directors (2010-current), Southwest District of AAHPERD (2013-2015), Beginning Teacher Standards Revision Task Force for AAHPERD/SHAPE America (2013-2016), AAHPERD's Research Consortium Board (2006-2008), and SHAPE America's Research Council (2017-current). Previously, Dr. van der Mars was presented with the National Association for Sport & Physical Education's (NASPE) Curriculum & Instruction Academy Honor Award (2013), and Physical Education Teacher Education Honor Award (2011).
