I recently finished reading *Game of Edges: The Analytics Revolution and the Future of Professional Sports* by Bruce Schoenfeld. However, Schoenfeld also suggests that coaches have succeeded in spite of the data, recognizing that the human element is often hard to predict. While we sometimes must make hard decisions based on the data we're given, like awarding a low grade or cutting that funding, we must also see the broader picture and make decisions that might have positive, long-lasting effects. Let's continue to remember that as we serve people in our organization and vocation.
