
The 2022 conference theme is *Embracing the Future: Navigating a Hybrid World.*The 2022 conference strands are:

- Meeting the Needs of Today's Students: In this strand, presentations will focus on how
  faculty can effectively engage a new generation of students in course work using multiple
  modalities.
- Advocating Via Virtual Formats: In this strand, presentations will focus on advocacy
  practices for funds and FaceTime with various stakeholders necessary to keep our
  programs and our institutions moving forward.
- <u>Leading During Trying Times</u>: In this strand, presentations will focus on best practices for leaders when times get tough.
- <u>Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion</u>: In this strand, presentations will focus on transforming our institutional practices (hiring, civility, mentoring, promotion and tenure) to be more diverse, equitable, and inclusive.
- Instructional Physical Activity Programs: In this strand, presentations will have a specific focus on instructional physical activity programs. Presentations tied to the conference theme are preferred, but all proposals about instructional physical activity programs will be considered.


A NAKHE publication, the IJKHE consists of peer-reviewed manuscripts, with a special focus on presenting the work of early-career professionals and graduate students.
